

## **Driving Directions to Whistler, BC Canada**



Highway 99 is rated as one of the world's most scenic drives. From the ocean-side views between Vancouver and Squamish to the majestic mountain vistas throughout the entire journey Highway 99 is truly a pleasurable driving experience.

The Highway is also experiencing a major upgrade in preparation for the 2010 Winter Games.

### **Driving Directions to Whistler**

#### **Seattle through Vancouver**

Typical Travel Time: 4 hours 20 minutes.

The US-Canada border crossing is 176 km or 100 miles from Seattle.

- Travelling north take the Interstate 5 (the I-5) to the very last exit before the Canadian border crossing (Do not cross the Peace Arch border crossing).
- Cross into Canada and head North on the highway for about 15 miles until you intersect with Route 1 - the Trans Canada Highway. (Do not take 1A).
- Take route 1 West. At Horseshoe Bay Route 1 becomes Highway 99. Whistler is about 1.5 hours away.

#### **From Vancouver Airport**

Typical Travel Time: 2 hours 15 minutes.

- Exit parking lot and continue straight.
- Proceed over Arthur Laing Bridge.
- Take Marine Drive East to Boundary Road.
- Turn left into Boundary Road and continue for about 10 kilometres.
- Take a left at 1st Avenue.
- Take route 1 West. At Horseshoe Bay Route 1 becomes Highway 99.
- Whistler is about 1.5 hours away.

#### **Horseshoe Bay to Whistler - on Highway 99**

Typical Travel Time: 1 hours 45 minutes.

- At Horseshoe Bay continue traveling north on Highway 99 all the way through to Whistler. You will pass through Squamish (approximately the halfway point).
- You will first see the Creekside area of Whistler.
- To east (towards the base of Whistler Mountain) at Lake Placid Road and follow about 100 metres to Lake Placid Lodge. Parking is available underground at the Whistler Creekside retail area.
